The Regular Council Meeting of the Mayor and Council was called to order by Mayor Robert Brown at 7:00 pm.

AMENDMENT OF REDEVELOPMENT AGREEMENT**

WHEREAS, the Borough of Neptune City has authorized the designation of an Area in need of Redevelopment as provided in the New Jersey Local Redevelopment and Housing Law; and

WHEREAS, the Borough of Neptune City by Ordinance 2010-03 adopted February 22, 2010, adopted a Redevelopment Plan known as "Steiner Avenue Scattered Sites Redevelopment Area"; and

WHEREAS, 99 Steiner Avenue (Block 12, Lots 10 & 14) are included in the Steiner Avenue Scattered Sites Redevelopment Plan; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Neptune City, by Resolution 2012-44, designated Neptune City Partners, LLC as Redeveloper for 99 Steiner Avenue (Block 12, Lots 10 & 14) in the Steiner Avenue Scattered Sites Redevelopment Area; and

WHEREAS, Neptune City Partners, LLC and the Borough are about to enter into (1) a Redevelopment Agreement and (2) a Financial Agreement, also known as a "P.I.L.O.T. Agreement"; and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Neptune City that the Mayor and Borough Clerk be and they are herewith authorized to sign and acknowledge, respectively, a Redevelopment Agreement and a Financial Agreement, also known as a "P.I.L.O.T. Agreement", confirming the within terms of same being entered into between the Borough and Neptune City Partners, LLC as designated Redeveloper of Block 12, Lots 10 and 14 in the Steiner Avenue Scattered Sites Redevelopment Plan; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that a copy of this Resolution be forwarded to Neptune City Partners, LLC.

**RESOLUTION 2013-37
APPROVAL OF SPECIAL EMERGENCY APPROPRIATION NOTES**

WHEREAS, it has been found necessary to make an Emergency Appropriation to meet certain extraordinary expenses incurred by Hurricane Sandy; and

WHEREAS, NJS40:4-53 provides that it shall be lawful to make such appropriation which appropriation and or special emergency notes issued to finance the same shall be provided for in such succeeding annual budgets by the inclusion of an appropriation of at least one fifth of the amount authorized pursuant to this act.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that in accordance with the provisions of NJS40A:4-55:

1. An emergency appropriation is hereby made for Hurricane Sandy in the amount of \$250,000.00.
2. That the emergency appropriation shall be provided for in the budgets of the next succeeding years by the inclusion of not less than \$50,000.00.
3. That an emergency Note not in excess of the amount authorized pursuant to law, be provided.

4. That such note be executed by William Folk, Chief Financial Officer.
5. That said note shall be dated April 12, 2013 may be renewed from time to time provided that such not and any renewals shall mature and be paid in the amount of not less than one fifth of the total amount appropriated by this resolution in any such year after the authorization.
6. That the statement required by the Local Finance Board has been filed with the clerk and a copy will be transmitted to the Director of the Division of Local Government Services.
7. That two copies of this resolution will be filed with the Director of the Division of Local Government Services, however no approval is required by the Division.

**RESOLUTION 2013-40
APPROVALS FOR MONMOUTH COUNTY MOSQUITO COMMISSION**

WHEREAS, the Governing Body of the Borough of Neptune City in the County of Monmouth, State of New Jersey, a municipal corporation, is required to authorize the Monmouth County Mosquito Extermination Commission to apply pesticides from aircraft over portions of the Borough of Neptune City; and

WHEREAS, the Borough understands that all pesticides are registered with the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection for aerial application by the State and the United States Environmental Protection Agency, and

WHEREAS, it is further understood that the areas being treated are only those found to have a significantly high mosquito population and may present either a public health nuisance or disease factor; and

WHEREAS, the approval is subject to the Monmouth County Mosquito Extermination Commission notifying the Neptune City Police Department prior to each and every application; and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Neptune City do hereby authorize the aerial application of pesticides according to the above standards and provisions.
