BOND ORDINANCE 2021 - 02

BOND ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE STEINER AVENUE PEDESTRIAN AND ADA IMPROVEMENTS PHASE 3, APPROPRIATING \$425,000 AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$245,395 BONDS OR NOTES OF THE BOROUGH FOR FINANCING PART OF THE COST THEREOF.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Borough Council of the Borough of Neptune City, in the County of Monmouth, New Jersey (not less than two-thirds of all members thereof affirmatively concurring) as follows:

Section 1. The capital improvement described in Section 3 of this Bond Ordinance is hereby authorized by the Borough of Neptune City, New Jersey. For the capital improvement described in Section 3, there is hereby appropriated the sum of \$425,000, which includes \$50,000 in costs as permitted by *N.J.S.A. 40A:2-20* and a Community Development Block Grant in the amount of \$179,605 that satisfies the down payment for the said purpose as required by the Local Bond Law.

Section 2. In order to finance the cost of the Steiner Avenue Pedestrian and ADA Improvements Phase 3 not covered by the aforementioned grant, negotiable bonds are hereby authorized to be issued in the principal amount of \$245,395 pursuant to the Local Bond Law. In anticipation of issuance of the bonds, negotiable bond anticipation notes are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to and within the limitations prescribed by the Local Bond Law.

Section 3. The Steiner Avenue Pedestrian and ADA Improvements Phase 3 are hereby authorized and the purpose for which the bonds are to be issued. The minimum period of usefulness is ten years.

Section 4. All bond anticipation notes issued hereunder shall mature at such times as may be determined by the chief financial officer; provided that no note shall mature later than one year from its date. The notes shall bear interest at such rate or rates and be in such form as may be determined by the chief financial officer. The chief financial officer shall determine all matters in connection with notes issued pursuant to this ordinance, and the chief financial officer's signature upon the notes shall be conclusive evidence as to all such determinations. All notes issued hereunder may be renewed from time to time subject to the provisions of *N.J.S.A. 40A:2-8(a)*. The chief financial officer is hereby authorized to sell part or all of the notes from time to time at public or private sale and to deliver them to the purchaser thereof upon receipt of payment of the purchase price plus accrued interest from their dates to the date of delivery thereof. The chief financial officer is directed to report in writing to the governing body at the meeting next succeeding the date when any sale or delivery of the notes pursuant to this ordinance is made. Such report must include the amount, the description, the interest rate, and the maturity schedule of the notes sold, the price obtained, and the name of the purchaser.

Section 5. The capital budget of the Borough of Neptune City is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this Ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency therewith; and the resolutions promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing full detail of the amended Capital Budget and Capital Program as approved by the Director of the Division of Local Government Services, is on file with the Municipal Clerk and is available for public inspection.

Section 6. The following additional matters are hereby determined, declared, recited and stated:

(a) The purchase described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance is not a current expense. It is an improvement that the Borough may lawfully undertake as a general improvement, and no

part of the cost thereof has been or shall be specially assessed on property specially benefitted thereby.

(b) The Supplemental Debt Statement required by the Local Bond Law has been duly prepared and filed in the Office of the Clerk, and a complete executed duplicate thereof has been filed in the Office of the Director of the Division of Local Government Services in the Department of Community Affairs of the State of New Jersey. The gross debt of the Borough of Neptune City is increased by the authorization of the bonds or notes provided in this bond ordinance by \$245,395, and the obligations authorized herein will be within all debt limitations prescribed by law.

(c) An aggregate amount not exceeding \$50,000 for items of expense listed in and permitted under *N.J.S.A. 40A:2-20* may be included in the costs of the purchase authorized in Section 3 hereof and is included in the foregoing estimate thereof.

Section 7. The full faith and credit of the Borough are hereby pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of an interest on the obligations authorized by this bond ordinance. The obligations shall be direct, unlimited obligations of the Borough and the Borough shall be obligated to levy ad valorem taxes upon all the taxable property within the Borough for the payment of the obligations and interest thereon without limitation on rate or amount.

Section 8. That in the event any moneys are received by the Borough from the United States of America, or from the State of New Jersey or any of its agencies, or from any other sources for the purchase provided for herein prior to the issuance of any of the bonds or notes authorized by this ordinance, the amount of such bonds or notes authorized herein shall be reduced by the amount so received prior to the issuance of any such bonds or notes.

Section 9. This bond ordinance shall take effect twenty (20) days after the first

publication thereof after final adoption, as provided by the Local Bond Law.

BOND ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE IMPROVEMENTS TO ADAMS FIELD, APPROPRIATING \$400,000 AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$150,000 BONDS OR NOTES OF THE BOROUGH FOR FINANCING PART OF THE COST THEREOF.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Borough Council of the Borough of Neptune City, in the County of Monmouth, New Jersey (not less than two-thirds of all members thereof affirmatively concurring) as follows:

Section 1. The capital improvement described in Section 3 of this Bond Ordinance is hereby authorized by the Borough of Neptune City, New Jersey. For the capital improvement described in Section 3, there is hereby appropriated the sum of \$400,000, which includes \$50,000 in costs as permitted by *N.J.S.A. 40A:2-20* and a Monmouth County Open Space Grant in the amount of \$250,000 that satisfies the down payment for the said purpose as required by the Local Bond Law.

Section 2. In order to finance the cost of the Improvements to Adams Field not covered by the aforementioned grant, negotiable bonds are hereby authorized to be issued in the principal amount of \$150,000 pursuant to the Local Bond Law. In anticipation of issuance of the bonds, negotiable bond anticipation notes are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to and within the limitations prescribed by the Local Bond Law.

Section 3. The Improvements to Adams Field are hereby authorized and the purpose for which the bonds are to be issued. The minimum period of usefulness is ten years.

Section 4. All bond anticipation notes issued hereunder shall mature at such times as

may be determined by the chief financial officer; provided that no note shall mature later than one year from its date. The notes shall bear interest at such rate or rates and be in such form as may be determined by the chief financial officer. The chief financial officer shall determine all matters in connection with notes issued pursuant to this ordinance, and the chief financial officer's signature upon the notes shall be conclusive evidence as to all such determinations. WHEREAS, Law enforcement and correctional police officers in this State and throughout the nation are routinely called upon to serve and protect their fellow citizens; and

WHEREAS, Law enforcement officers protect the community by responding to horrendous events and acting heroically to save the lives of others; and

WHEREAS, Correctional police officers provide public safety and security through the custody and management of those individuals incarcerated within the criminal justice system; and

WHEREAS, It is increasingly dangerous to perform these jobs in a world where law enforcement and correctional police officers are targeted for the uniforms they wear and the duties they perform in service to their community; and

WHEREAS, Law enforcement and correctional police officers in this State and throughout the nation serve with valor, dignity, and integrity; and

WHEREAS, As of October 2020, 235 law enforcement officers died in the line of duty in the United States in less than one year, including nine officers in New Jersey; and

WHEREAS, As COVID-19 continues to spread around the country, the first responders on the front lines are increasingly vulnerable to contracting the virus and at least eight correctional police officers have died resulting from this pandemic; and

WHEREAS, These officer's deaths are a sober reminder that our nation's law enforcement and correctional police officers face danger every day they carry out their sworn duty to protect the citizens of this country; and

WHEREAS, Countless other law enforcement and correctional police officers are injured and disabled each year while performing their duties; and

WHEREAS, These burdens are carried not only by law enforcement and correctional police officers, but also by their families who make personal sacrifices in order for these officers to carry out their duties; and

WHEREAS, In light of recent negativity directed toward law enforcement nationally, there is a need to show law enforcement and correctional police officers that our citizens recognize the difficult career these officers have chosen; and

WHEREAS, These men and women, by their distinctive service and dedicated efforts as law enforcement and correctional police officers, have earned our highest respect and deepest gratitude;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and Council of the Neptune City, County of Monmouth, State of New Jersey that we support the adoption a Joint Assembly Resolution (197) designating the month of May of each year as “Law Enforcement and Correctional Police Officer Appreciation Month in the State of New Jersey to encourage the citizens of this State to join in the observance of this month and provide appreciation for the law enforcement and correctional police officers who serve and protect them.

Section II – Financial Statement Findings

Material Weakness in Internal Control Over Financial Reporting

Comment 2019-001:

Condition:

The analysis of the various accounts in the Trust Other Fund revealed that there are considerable amounts unidentified within the fund.

Criteria:

In order to assure effective internal controls over the various trust accounts, it is imperative the individual control totals within the fund be reconciled to subsidiary ledgers.

Context:

During our basic audit procedures, we noted that there was a comment in the audit of the previous year. We determined the finding had not been rectified in the year under audit. Based on discussions with management it would appear there are amounts that have been carried in the trust fund for which no subsidiary ledgers exist. Furthermore, there was a bank account that was discovered in 2019 by management. The account was not included in the 2018 audit report of the Trust Fund. The account is now included in the Other Trust Fund reserves as "Unidentified," along with other unidentifiable funds.

Cause:

There is a material weakness in one or all of the following: the design, implementation and monitoring over internal controls related to the preparation of financial statements that are presented fairly, free of material misstatements in accordance with New Jersey Statutes. It appears these issues have existed for years and date back to a previous finance administration.

Effect:

There is uncertainty related to the nature of some of the various trust reserve balances.

Recommendation:

Internal controls over the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements in accordance with the accounting principles promulgated by the Division of Local Government Services should be reviewed and revised as needed to reasonably ensure the accounting policies of the governing body and those of the Division of Local Government Services are being carried out as intended, and also to ensure the safe keeping of the assets of the tax payers. Also, a detailed analysis of all the trust reserves should be prepared and if this is not possible, then action should be taken to cancel any unidentified balances.

Management's Response:

The Other Trust Fund was not accurately maintained by the Borough of Neptune City from at least 2007 through 2015. The current Chief Financial Officer and Tax Collector attempted to analyze the aforementioned years in an attempt to reconcile the account however, numerous records that would be needed to substantiate the balances are not available. The unidentified balances cannot reasonably be identified. The Borough intends to retain the unidentified balance in the Other Trust Fund for a number of years in the event that a valid claim is presented to the Borough.

WHEREAS, all members of the governing body have received and have familiarized themselves with, at least, the minimum requirements of the Local Finance Board of the State of New Jersey, as stated aforesaid and have subscribed to the affidavit, as provided by the Local Finance Board, and

WHEREAS, failure to comply with the regulations of the Local Finance Board of the State of New Jersey may subject the members of the local governing body to the penalty provisions of R.S. 52:27BB-52, to wit:

R.S. 52:27BB-52: A local officer or member of a local governing body who, after a date fixed for compliance, fails or refuses to obey an order of the director (Director of Local Government Services), under the provisions of this Article, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction, may be fined not more than one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) or imprisoned for not more than one year, or both, in addition shall forfeit his office.

APPLICATION TO TEMPORARILY CLOSE MIDWOOD STREET

WHEREAS, the residents at 3 Midwood Street have submitted an application to close a portion of Midwood Street on June 12, 2021, and
