BOROUGH ADMINISTRATORS REPORT: Christopher Cherbini

A/Cherbini reported

- 1) CDBG voting was completed and we came in 3rd with a recommendation of \$178,000.00 for 2021 to complete phase 3 of Steiner Avenue handicap ramps.
- 2) The Playground equipment was delivered to Memorial Park and work will begin soon weather permitting.
- 3) First Responder Park is almost completed, and the hope is to have it closed out in October.
- 4) We received an email that our second round of CARES Act was approved and a check will be issued to the Borough soon.

MAYORS REPORT: Mayor Andrew Wardell

Mayor Wardell reported:

I. Covid-19

- A. As of today there are 31 new positive cases in Monmouth County bringing the total number of 11,919 cases since March.
- B. Neptune City has 74 positive cases which is down 6 from 80 at our last meeting.
- C. October 5th Library will open
- D. October 15th community Center
 - 1. Both limited capacity and events.
- II. First Responder Park
 - 1. Landscaping has been planted
 - 2. Grass seed is beginning to grow.
 - 3. The last step will be the monuments for each park.

III. Land-Use

- 1. There are two parcels of land in Neptune City that we would like the Land Use Board to review and recommend be Redevelopment areas.
 - 1. Block 1 Lot 18
 - 2. Block 13 Lot 1 (East Coast Ice)
- 2. Both of these Areas are blighted and in serious need of an upgrade. This, I believe, will not only help clean up the area, but will also remediate a contamination site and put the property back on the tax rolls.
- IV. I would like to thank the County and especially Freehold Director Tom Arnone for having me as a guest on an episode of Monmouth in Focus today.
 - 1. This really gave us a great opportunity to highlight Neptune City.
- V. Neptune City Fall Festival

- 1. This Saturday, Oct. 3rd, was supposed to be our first annual Neptune City Fall Festival.
 - 1. Food Trucks
 - 2. Vendors/Farmers Market
 - 3. Entertainment
 - 4. Capped off with a movie in the Park.
- 2. Unfortunately, due to restrictions from Covid-19 it will have to be postponed till next year.
- 3. This was supposed to be the rebranding of of Neptune City Day
 - 1. Neptune City Day was never tax funded; all from donations and fundraisers
 - 2. Was self-sustaining for many years, but began to lose interest and began to lose money.
 - 3. Very difficult to find volunteers
 - 4. Next year we will have a great festival

ADMINISTRATION & FINANCE- Brian Thomas

C/Thomas reported with the capital budget plan in place, the deadline is approaching. C/Thomas explained the reason for the plan is to plan for future purchases so we can remain fiscally sound and keep the Municipal taxes flat.

PUBLIC WORKS- Brian Sullivan

C/Sullivan had no report

LAW & ORDINANCE - Dave Calhoun

C/Calhoun reported that there was a Law and Ordinance Committee meeting held and the agenda consisted of the amendment of park hours at Memorial Park. He also stated that he was happy that Mayor Wardell asked him to chair the Stigma Free initiative for Neptune City. He stated that he reached out to several community members that will be representative of the target groups we are trying to reach, which will include those with issues related to PTSD, loneliness, bullying, and a reach out to the LGBTQ community. Other groups will be added/excluded based on committee discussion. Committee members will be chosen from among stakeholders in the community with relevant knowledge or expertise. A/ Cherbini and I will attempt regular contact with the County as our partner in the initiative. He also contacted several community members to participate, including Dr. Boccutti from WWES, and will finalize the list and hold a first committee meeting within the next two weeks and report progress to the council regularly.

C/Calhoun also stated that he attended the latest Board of Rec Meeting. The next movie in the park is Frozen 2 on 10/3/20. The last movie of the year will be Addams Family to coincide with Halloween. C/ Thomas, A/ Cherbini and he are working to secure possible candy donations from the Community and from relevant business sponsors that will allow us to distribute candy to the kids during the movie event on 10/3/20 in a socially distant manner.

ADMNISTRATION & JUSTICE-Danielle Pappas

SPECIAL SERVICES-Pamela Renee

C/Renee reported that Letters were mailed out to all residents who have not yet sent in their dog license renewals this year, and we are receiving renewals in response to the letters.

- Trees and vegetation have been planted at First Responders Park and it looks beautiful. I commend the contractors for doing a nice job. Depending on how everything grows back in the Spring, we might also like to consider an additional Arbor Day tree planting ceremony there.

AUTHORIZING AND DIRECTING THE NEPTUNE CITY LAND USE BOARD TO UNDERTAKE PRELIMINARY INVESTIGATION TO DETERMINE WHETHER BLOCK 13, LOT 1 ON THE OFFICIAL TAX MAP OF THE BOROUGH OF NEPTUNE CITY (87 ROSEWOOD PLACE) QUALIFIES AS A NON-CONDEMNATION REDEVELOPMENT AREA UNDER THE LOCAL REDEVELOPMENT AND HOUSING LAW

WHEREAS, the Local Redevelopment and Housing Law, <u>N.J.S.A.</u> 40A:12A-1, <u>et. seq.</u>, provides municipal governments with the authority to promote programs of redevelopment;

WHEREAS, the Local Redevelopment and Housing Law requires that before an area is deemed an area in need of redevelopment, the governing body of the municipality is required, by resolution, to authorize and direct its Planning Board, or joint land use board if applicable, to undertake a preliminary investigation to determine whether a proposed area meets the criteria set forth in N.J.S.A. 40A:12A-5; and

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A:12-6 requires that the resolution of a municipal government directing and authorizing the appropriate land use board to undertake a preliminary investigation must state whether the redevelopment area determination shall authorize the municipality to use all powers provided by the Legislature for use in a redevelopment area other than eminent domain ("Non-Condemnation Redevelopment Area") or whether the redevelopment area determination shall authorize the municipality to use all powers provided by the Legislature in a redevelopment area, including the power of eminent domain ("Condemnation Redevelopment Area"); and

WHEREAS, the Borough of Neptune City holds legal title to the real property located at Block 13, Lot 1 on the official Tax Map of the Borough of Neptune City (the "Study Area");

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Neptune City find it to be in the best interest of the Borough and its residents to authorize the Neptune City Land Use Board to undertake a preliminary investigation of the Study Area pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:12A-4 and N.J.S.A. 40A:12A-6; and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Governing Body of the Borough of Neptune City that the Neptune City Land Use Board is hereby authorized and directed to conduct the necessary preliminary investigation of the Study Area pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:12A-5 to determine whether it qualifies as a Non-Condemnation Redevelopment Area under the criteria set forth in N.J.S.A. 40A:12A-1, et. seq.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Neptune City Land Use Board shall submit its findings and recommendations to the Governing Body in the form of a Resolution with supporting documentation.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that a certified copy of this resolution shall be forwarded to the Neptune City Land Use Board.

WHEREAS, the Local Redevelopment and Housing Law, <u>N.J.S.A.</u> 40A:12A-1, <u>et. seq.</u>, provides municipal governments with the authority to promote programs of redevelopment;

WHEREAS, the Local Redevelopment and Housing Law requires that before an area is deemed an area in need of redevelopment, the governing body of the municipality is required, by

resolution, to authorize and direct its Planning Board, or joint land use board if applicable, to undertake a preliminary investigation to determine whether a proposed area meets the criteria set forth in N.J.S.A. 40A:12A-5; and

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A:12-6 requires that the resolution of a municipal government directing and authorizing the appropriate land use board to undertake a preliminary investigation must state whether the redevelopment area determination shall authorize the municipality to use all powers provided by the Legislature for use in a redevelopment area other than eminent domain ("Non-Condemnation Redevelopment Area") or whether the redevelopment area determination shall authorize the municipality to use all powers provided by the Legislature in a redevelopment area, including the power of eminent domain ("Condemnation Redevelopment Area"); and

WHEREAS, the Borough of Neptune City holds legal title to the real property located at Block 1, Lot 18 on the official Tax Map of the Borough of Neptune City (the "Study Area");

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Neptune City find it to be in the best interest of the Borough and its residents to authorize the Neptune City Land Use Board to undertake a preliminary investigation of the Study Area pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:12A-4 and N.J.S.A. 40A:12A-6; and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Governing Body of the Borough of Neptune City that the Neptune City Land Use Board is hereby authorized and directed to conduct the necessary preliminary investigation of the Study Area pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:12A-5 to determine whether it qualifies as a Non-Condemnation Redevelopment Area under the criteria set forth in N.J.S.A. 40A:12A-1, et. seq.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Neptune City Land Use Board shall submit its findings and recommendations to the Governing Body in the form of a Resolution with supporting documentation.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that a certified copy of this resolution shall be forwarded to the Neptune City Land Use Board.
