#### **ORDINANCE 2024-04**

### BOROUGH OF NEPTUNE CITY COUNTY OF MONMOUTH

ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING ENTRY OF A REAL ESTATE PURCHASE AND SALE AGREEMENT WITH GENESIS REDEVELOPMENT, LLC AS THE DESIGNATED REDEVELOPER OF BLOCK 13, LOT 1 (87 ROSEWOOD PLACE) WITHIN THE EAST COAST ICE HOUSE REDEVELOPMENT AREA

WHEREAS, the Borough of Neptune City (the "<u>Borough</u>") is the owner of certain parcels of land located within the East Coast Ice House Redevelopment Plan ("<u>Redevelopment Plan</u>") Area, which includes Block 13, Lot 1 (87 Rosewood Place) on the Borough's official tax map (the "Borough Property"); and

**WHEREAS,** the Borough has designated Genesis Redevelopment, LLC (the "<u>Redeveloper</u>") as the designated redeveloper of the Borough Property and is entering a Redevelopment Agreement (the "<u>Redevelopment Agreement</u>") for the redevelopment of the Borough Property into a commercial use permitted under the Redevelopment Plan (the "<u>Project</u>"); and

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:12A-8(g) the Borough is authorized to "convey property or improvements to any other party . . . without public bidding and at such prices and upon such terms as it deems reasonable, provided that the . . . conveyance is made in conjunction with a redevelopment plan . . . . "; and

**WHEREAS**, in accordance with the Redevelopment Agreement and the Redevelopment Plan (as defined in the Redevelopment Agreement), the Borough has determined that the proposed Real Estate Purchase and Sale Agreement is essential to the development of the Project.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED** by the Borough Council of the Borough of Neptune City in the County of Monmouth, State of New Jersey as follows:

- **SECTION 1.** The above recitals are incorporated by reference as if fully set forth herein.
- **SECTION 2.** The Borough Council hereby accepts and approves the Real Estate Purchase and Sale Agreement for the conveyance of Block 13, Lot 1 to Genesis Redevelopment, LLC as the designated redeveloper of the Property One Dollar (\$1.00), plus all costs associated with the environmental remediation of the Borough Property, and other good and valuable consideration as shall be provided by the Buyer in accordance herewith, subject to the terms of the Redevelopment Agreement.
- **SECTION 3.** The Borough Council hereby authorizes and directs the Mayor or Borough Administrator to execute the Real Estate Purchase and Sale Agreement upon adoption of this Ordinance.
- **SECTION 4.** The Borough Council hereby authorizes and directs the Borough Administrator, Chief Financial Officer, and other Borough employees and agents to take any necessary and appropriate actions to effectuate the implementation of this Ordinance and the Real Estate Purchase and Sale Agreement.
- **SECTION 5.** All ordinances or resolutions of the Borough which are inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed as to the extent of such inconsistency.
- **SECTION 6.** If any section, subsection, clause or phrase of this Ordinance is for any reason held to be unconstitutional or invalid by any court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the remaining portion of this Ordinance.
  - **SECTION 7.** This Ordinance shall take effect upon final passage, approval and publication in accordance with law.

# ORDINANCE NO. 2024-05 BOROUGH OF NEPTUNE CITY COUNTY OF MONMOUTH AN ORDINANCE APPROPRIATING \$7,000 FROM CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT FUND FOR EMERGENCY VEHICLE

**BE IT ORDAINED** by the Borough Council of the Borough of Neptune City, in the County of Monmouth, New Jersey (not less than two-thirds of all members thereof affirmatively concurring) as follows:

**Section 1.** The capital improvements described in Section 2 of this Bond Ordinance are hereby authorized by the Borough of Neptune City, New Jersey. For the capital improvements described in Section 2, an amount of \$7,000 is appropriated from the Capital Improvement Fund to finance the total cost.

**Section 2.** The following purchases are hereby authorized:

Emergency Vehicle \$7,000

The minimum period of usefulness is five years.

**Section 3.** The capital budget of the Borough of Neptune City is in agreement with the provisions of this Ordinance.

**Section 4.** The following additional matters are hereby determined, declared, recited and stated:

The purchases described in Section 2 of this bond ordinance are not a current expense. It is an improvement that the Borough may lawfully undertake as a general improvement, and no part of the cost thereof has been or shall be specially assessed on property specially benefitted thereby.

**Section 5.** This bond ordinance shall take effect twenty (20) days after the first publication thereof after final adoption, as provided by the Local Bond Law.

## BOND ORDINANCE 2024 – 06 BOROUGH OF NEPTUNE CITY, COUNTY OF MONMOUTH

BOND ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR ADDITIONAL ROADWAY IMPROVEMENTS APPROPRIATING \$100,000 AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$95,000 BONDS OR NOTES OF THE BOROUGH FOR FINANCING PART OF THE COST THEREOF.

**BE IT ORDAINED** by the Borough Council of the Borough of Neptune City, in the County of Monmouth, New Jersey (not less than two-thirds of all members thereof affirmatively concurring) as follows:

- **Section 1.** The capital improvement described in Section 3 of this Bond Ordinance is hereby authorized by the Borough of Neptune City, New Jersey. For the capital improvement described in Section 3, there is hereby appropriated the sum of \$100,000, which includes \$5,000 in costs as permitted by *N.J.S.A. 40A:2-20* and \$5,000 as the down payment for the said purpose as required by the Local Bond Law.
- **Section 2.** In order to finance the cost of the Additional Roadway Improvements, negotiable bonds are hereby authorized to be issued in the principal amount of \$95,000 pursuant to the Local Bond Law. In anticipation of issuance of the bonds, negotiable bond anticipation notes are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to and within the limitations prescribed by the Local Bond Law.
- **Section 3.** The Additional Roadway Improvements Program are hereby authorized and the purpose for which the bonds are to be issued. The minimum period of usefulness is ten years.
- Section 4. All bond anticipation notes issued hereunder shall mature at such times as may be determined by the chief financial officer, provided that no note shall mature later than one year from its date. The notes shall bear interest at such rate or rates and be in such form as may be determined by the chief financial officer. The chief financial officer shall determine all matters in connection with notes issued pursuant to this ordinance, and the chief financial officer's signature upon the notes shall be conclusive evidence as to all such determinations. All notes issued hereunder may be renewed from time to time subject to the provisions of *N.J.S.A. 40A:2-8(a)*. The chief financial officer is hereby authorized to sell part or all the notes from time to time at public or private sale and to deliver them to the purchaser thereof upon receipt of payment of the purchase price plus accrued interest from their dates to the date of delivery thereof. The chief financial officer is directed to report in writing to the governing body at the meeting next succeeding the date when any sale or delivery of the notes pursuant to this ordinance is made. Such a report must include the amount, the description, the interest rate, and the maturity schedule of the notes sold, the price obtained, and the name of the purchaser.
- **Section 5.** The capital budget of the Borough of Neptune City is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this Ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency therewith; and the resolutions promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing full detail of the amended Capital Budget and Capital Program as approved by the Director of the Division of Local Government Services, is on file with the Municipal Clerk and is available for public inspection.
  - **Section 6.** The following additional matters are hereby determined, declared, recited, and stated:
- (a) The purchase described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance is not a current expense. It is an improvement that the Borough may lawfully undertake as a general improvement, and no part of the cost thereof has been or should be specially assessed on property specially benefitted thereby.
- **(b)** The Supplemental Debt Statement required by the Local Bond Law has been duly prepared and filed in the Office of the Clerk, and a complete executed duplicate thereof has been filed in the Office of the Director of the Division of Local Government Services in the Department of Community Affairs of the State of New Jersey. The gross debt of the Borough of Neptune City is increased by the authorization of the bonds or notes provided in this bond ordinance by \$95,000, and the obligations authorized herein will be within all debt limitations prescribed by law.
- (c) An aggregate amount not exceeding \$5,000 for items of expense listed in and permitted under *N.J.S.A.* 40A:2-20 may be included in the costs of the purchase authorized in Section 3 hereof and is included in the foregoing estimate thereof.
- **Section 7.** The full faith and credit of the Borough are hereby pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of an interest on the obligations authorized by this bond ordinance. The obligations shall be direct, unlimited

obligations of the Borough and the Borough shall be obligated to levy ad valorem taxes upon all the taxable property within the Borough for the payment of the obligations and interest thereon without limitation on rate or amount.

**Section 8.** That in the event any moneys are received by the Borough from the United States of America, or from the State of New Jersey or any of its agencies, or from any other sources for the purchase provided for herein prior to the issuance of any of the bonds or notes authorized by this ordinance, the amount of such bonds or notes authorized herein shall be reduced by the amount so received prior to the issuance of any such bonds or notes.

**Section 9.** This bond ordinance shall take effect twenty (20) days after the first publication thereof after final adoption, as provided by the Local Bond Law.
